FBI is the domestic intelligence and security service of the United States. It reports to both the Attorney General and the Director of National Intelligence. A leading U.S. counter-terrorism, counter-intelligence, and criminal investigative organization, the FBI has jurisdiction over violations of more than 200 categories of federal crimes. The FBI's activities in support of national security are comparable to those of the British MI5.

The **CIA** is a civilian foreign intelligence service of the United States federal government. It deals with gathering, processing, and analyzing national security information from around the world and provides intelligence for the President and Cabinet. It is mainly focused on overseas intelligence gathering, with only limited domestic intelligence collection.

MI5 is the United Kingdom's domestic counter-intelligence and security agency and is part of its intelligence machinery alongside the Secret Intelligence Service (MI6). The service is directed to protect British parliamentary democracy and economic interests, and counter-terrorism and espionage within the UK.



NATO is an intergovernmental military alliance which was signed on 4 April 1949. Its member states agree to mutual defence in response to an attack by any external party. Three NATO members (the United States, France and the United Kingdom) are permanent members of the United Nations Security Council. NATO is an Alliance that consists of 28 independent member countries across North America and Europe. An additional 22 countries participate in NATO's Partnership for Peace program, with 15 other countries involved in dialogue programmes.
